Travis and Carlina are no strangers when it comes to the Agricultural world. Travis' Great Grandfather and Great Grandmother came to this valley in 1938. His Granddad and Grandmother followed in 1939, they homesteaded and started farmina. Carlina's family settled in Polvedera her arandfather was also a farmer. It was in their genes to follow in their footsteps. Travis and Carlina farm 250 acers in the middle Rio Grande Valley. They raise alfalfa, wheat and pasture grass hay.

While also running 25 head of Simental, Maine

and Angus cross cows that came from their kids 4-H/FFA projects.

Travis started in 4-H in 1976 where he began to compete in public speaking, arts and crafts, showing swine, heifers and steers. He joined FFA when he got to Highschool "the blue and gold jackets club" and continued his agricultural endeavors. He competed in judging contest such as Aa. Mechanics, land, dairy, entomology and participated in fundraisers to help his chapter with expenses throughout the years. He became vice president of the Socorro FFA chapter in 1983-1984.

Travis and Carlina Graduated in 1984 from Socorro High and that fall attended NMSU in Las Cruces. In 1986 they decided to get married and help on the family farm. Where today Travis and Carlina are now running the family farm with the help of his father and family.

Shortly after they welcomed their son Matthew and a couple years later their daughter Melanie. Their kids became involved in 4-H as soon as they could. Doing projects such as showing animals, judging contest, baking, gardening and more. They attended many different conferences during their time in 4-H and FFA.

As they got older Melanie served on the state leadership team her junior year. Travis and Carlina encourage all youth to get involved with 4-H and FFA and hope that it plays a big a part in their lives as it did their own, their children's and someday their grandkids.

In 1987 Travis & Carlina were encouraged by Marty and Shirleen Greenwood to be part of the Socorro County Fair board.

Serving on the livestock committee it wasn't long before he was elected to the board where he spent countless hours helping to prepare for the County fair and rodeo each year.

Carlina was also involved and served as the fair board livestock secretary. She also made sure their children's earninas at the sale each year went into the next years projects or put into savings for their futures. They continued to be heavily involved and serve on the board during their children's time in 4-H and FFA.

Matthew has a wife, Kristy. Melanie has two boys Michael and Adrian. They all help carry on the tradition and work on the family farm as well as their perspectives jobs.



Travis and Carlina are also involved in the Socorro County Farm & Livestock Bureau. Carlina serves as the Socorro County Farm & Livestock Bureau as president while also serving as vice chair of the women's committee for the New Mexico Farm & Livestock Bureau. Travis serves on the State board of directors as second vice president for the New Mexico Farm & Livestock Bureau and also director of the New Mexico Hay association. They are both members of First Baptist Church of Socorro where Carlina has been the ministerial secretary for over 20 years.

Travis and Carlina believe 4-H and FFA are two very beneficial organizations for kids to be involved in because it helps teach them to be productive and thriving members of the community. It instills in the youth skills such as leadership, public speaking, responsibility, working with others, a good work ethic and so much more. They are proud to be associated and involved in these agricultural entities and organizations.

Travis and Carlina are advocates for preserving the agricultural life as they know the importance of it and hardships that come alongside. They've continued to support the Socorro County Fair, local FFA chapter and the exhibitors at the sale. They wait for the day their grandkids are in the ring with their animals.

Entry Requirements

- Entries will be accepted between 7:00 am and 9:00 am on Thursday August 28, 2025
- Only one entry per participant per category.
- The official entry form (see below), \$10 entry fee, recipe used from the choices given on SCFRA FB page.
- The UPC code from the bag of King Arthur Flour used in the recipe, or receipt showing King Arthur Flour purchase.
- YOU MUST PROVIDE THE UPC CODE and or RECEIPT or ENTRY WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- All entries must be submitted on or in a disposable container for Judging.
- The Superintendent will inspect and accept all entries, and for food safety reasons and their decisions are final.

For Safety Reasons do NOT use icing that requires refrigeration.

- All entries will be displayed after competition is completed. Only a portion of the entry will be displayed if a whole item is entered, excess will be disposed of immediately after Judging. Ribbon will be displayed. Gift card award will be given to winner on pickup, Sunday, September 3, 2023 between 8 am and 10 am.
- Samples of each entry will be tasted and judged, therefore for food safety reasons DO NOT USE AN ICING OR FROSTING THAT REQUIRES REFRIGERATION.

GENERAL FAIR RULES & REGULATIONS

The Socorro County
Fair is open to all.
Anyone may enter any
department with the
exception of the 4-H and
FFA departments that
are limited to members
of a Socorro County 4-H
club and/or are enrolled
in a high school FFA
program in Socorro
County.

The Fair is governed by the Board of the Socorro County Fair and Rodeo Association which reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the rules and regulations of the fair and PRCA Rodeo, and arbitrarily settles and determines all matters, auestions and differences in regard to or connected with the Fair. In a case where no rule appears to cover a situation, the board reserves the right to make a rule and define its application for such a situation.

Any person who violates any of the

following or special rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and may be subject to such penalty as the governing board may order.

Any disagreements or complaints occurring during the Fair must be presented in writing to the department superintendent or a fair director before the fair board will consider the complaint. After careful consideration of the complaint, the decision of the fair board will be final.

Exhibits entered into the fair may be items for display, competition, or livestock animals. Any unlisted item may be entered at the discretion of the superintendent. Exhibits may be reclassified at the discretion of the superintendent.

An exhibit unworthy of an award will not

receive one even though there is no competition, nor will any exhibit receive an award greater than its merits justify. All judges will be informed of this rule and asked to comply with it. The decision of the judges will be final.

Diseased, maimed or soiled products or animals will not be allowed. No entries will be legal until approved by the respective superintendents or their representatives. Advertising or selling from space provided for competitive displays is prohibited. Items previously judged cannot be re-judged. They can be display exhibits only.

The board will use every precaution for the safekeeping of exhibits. The Socorro County Fair will use due diligence to ensure the safety of livestock or

articles entered for exhibit after their arrival and placement, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for any loss, injury, or damage done to any article on exhibit.

Any exhibitor who in any way, whether in person or by agents, interferes with Fair officials, or shows disrespect to them is subject to penalty as the Socorro County Fair and Rodeo Association deems necessary.

Association Board
may withhold from
such exhibitor all
premiums, which have
been awarded and/or
expel him/her from
further exhibiting at the

- The official entry form (see below), \$10 entry fee, salsa recipe and fresh salsa are needed to enter.
- Indicate on your entry the date it was made (Must be fresh made for competition or fresh preserved using the approved hot water method)
- Bring your entry in a one pint, sealable container such as a ball or mason jar with sealable lid or a "Zip Lock" type container with sealable lid
- The Contest Coordinator must inspect and accept all entries for food safety reasons and their decisions are final.

For Safety Reasons

- All entries will be kept on ice until judging time
- All entries will be disposed of after competition is completed. Only the empty food container (and trophy or ribbon) will be returned to the competitor
- Samples of salsa will be tasted and judged, therefore for food safety reasons, all salsa must be made fresh on the day of competition or canned/preserved using the hot-water canning method to be considered to judging. Seals will be tested before acceptance for judging.
