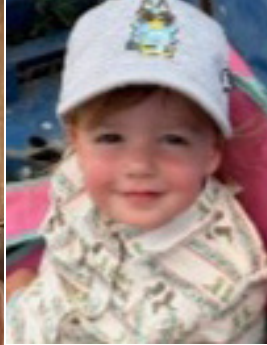

General Fair Rules & Regulations

The Socorro County Fair is open to all. Anyone may enter any department with the exception of the 4-H and FFA departments that are limited to members of a Socorro County 4-H club and/or are enrolled in a high school FFA program in Socorro County.

The Fair is governed by the Board of the Socorro County Fair and Rodeo Association which reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the rules and regulations of the fair and PRCA Rodeo, and arbitrarily settles and determines all matters, questions and differences in regard to or connected with the Fair. In a case where no rule appears to cover a situation, the board reserves the right to make a rule and define its application for such a situation.

Any person who violates any of the following or special rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and may be subject to such penalty as the governing board may order.

Any disagreements or complaints occurring during the Fair must be presented in writing to the department superintendent or a fair director before the fair board will consider the complaint. After careful consideration of the complaint, the decision of the fair board will be final.

Exhibits entered into the fair may be items for display, competition, or livestock animals. Any unlisted item may be entered at the discretion of the superintendent. Exhibits may be reclassified at the discretion of the superintendent.

An exhibit unworthy of an award will not receive one even though there is no competition, nor will any exhibit receive an award greater than its merits justify. All judges will be informed of this rule and asked to comply with it. The decision of the judges will be final.

Diseased, maimed or soiled products or animals will not be allowed. No entries will be legal until approved by the respective superintendents or their representatives. Advertising or selling from space provided for competitive displays is prohibited. Items previously judged cannot be re-judged. They can be display exhibits only.

The board will use every precaution for the safekeeping of exhibits. The Socorro County Fair will use due diligence to ensure the safety of livestock or articles entered for exhibit after their arrival and placement, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for any loss, injury, or damage done to any article on exhibit.

Any exhibitor who in any way, whether in person or by agents, interferes with Fair officials, or shows disrespect to them is subject to penalty as the Socorro County Fair and Rodeo Association deems necessary.

It is up to the Fair Official being harassed to make the official complaint to the Board. The Socorro County Fair & Rodeo Association Board may withhold from such exhibitor all premiums, which have been awarded and/or expel him/her from further exhibiting at the Socorro County Fair.

The Story Behind the Brand

Long before fences stretched across the West, a simple mark burned into a hide told a powerful story. A livestock brand identified ownership, protected hard-earned investments, and represented the reputation of the ranch and family behind it. Every brand was unique, carrying generations of history, pride, and tradition.

In 1598 the hot iron brand was first introduced into New Mexico by Don Juan de Onate, who trailed 7,000 head of branded cattle from the Mexican State of Chihuahua to “San Juan Del Los Caballeros”, near present day Santa Fe. Branding remains one of the oldest continuous ranching traditions in the United States. Many of the brands still seen today have been passed down through families for decades, becoming symbols of perseverance, stewardship, and a way of life that helped shape our communities.

Here in Socorro County, farming and ranching is more than an industry—it’s a heritage. The brands found throughout our valleys and mountains tell the story of local families who have cared for the land, raised livestock, and contributed to the agricultural roots of our county for generations.

As you explore this year’s fair, take a moment to appreciate the brands on display. Each one represents a unique piece of New Mexico history and the enduring legacy of the ranchers and youth who continue to carry those traditions into the future.

SAWS MUST BE ON GROUND WITH HANDS ON THE TIMBER. UPON "GO" THE SAW MUST BE STARTED ON THE GROUND, IF THE SAW IS LIFTED FROM THE GROUND BEFORE IT IS RUNNING THE CONTESTANT IS DISQUALIFIED. SAWS CAN BE STARTED AND WARMED UP JUST PRIOR TO CONTEST.

CHAINSAW CONTEST

MAKE 2 CUTS - CUT DOWN THEN CUT UP. CUTS MUST BE MADE BETWEEN OUTER EDGE OF LOG AND 2" - 4" FROM END. THE CUTS MUST BE THE FULL DIAMETER OF THE LOG, NO ANGLE CUTS. YOU CANNOT START A CUT - THEN REVERSE THE DIRECTION TO FINISH IT. WHOEVER COMPLETES THE SECOND CUT FIRST WINS THAT BRACKET AND ADVANCES. THIS IS A DOUBLE ELIMINATION COMPETITION. IN THE EVENT THE WOOD CUT BREAKS AND THE JUDGE CAN PUT THE PIECES TOGETHER TO MAKE A FULL PIECE, THE TIME WILL BE ALLOWED AND THE CONTESTANT WILL NOT BE DISQUALIFIED.

RUNOFFS FOR 1ST PLACE TIES ONLY, CONTESTANTS MAY CALL FOR A RE-CUT UPON AGREEMENT AND THE JUDGE'S DECISION. YOU MAY HAVE 3 MINUTES TO CHANGE THE BAR OR CHAIN IF YOU SAW MALFUNCTIONS, IF IT TAKES ANY LONGER THAN 3 MINUTES YOU WILL FORFEIT.

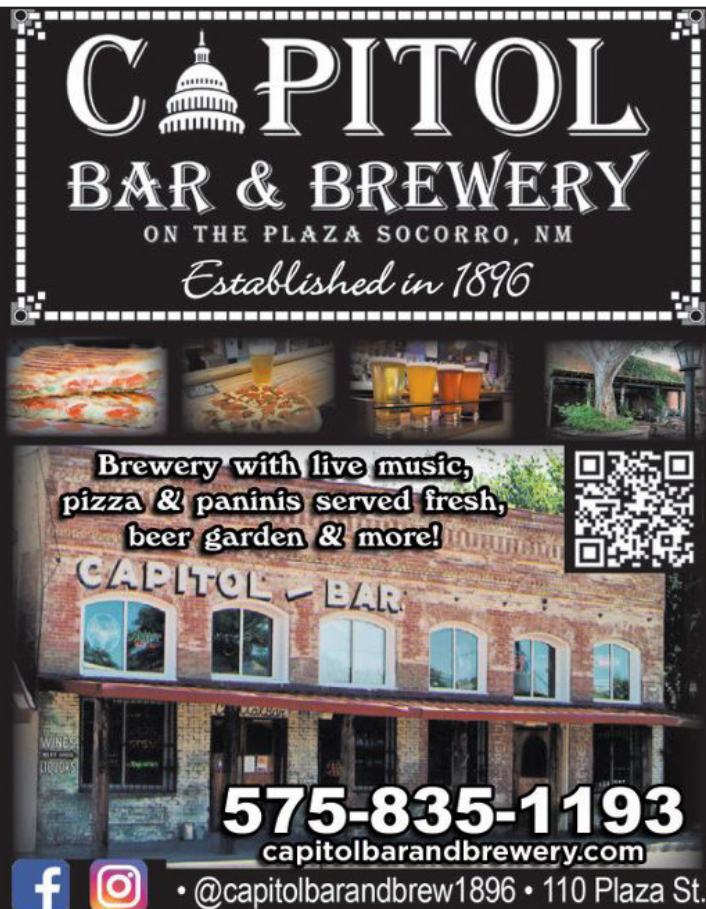

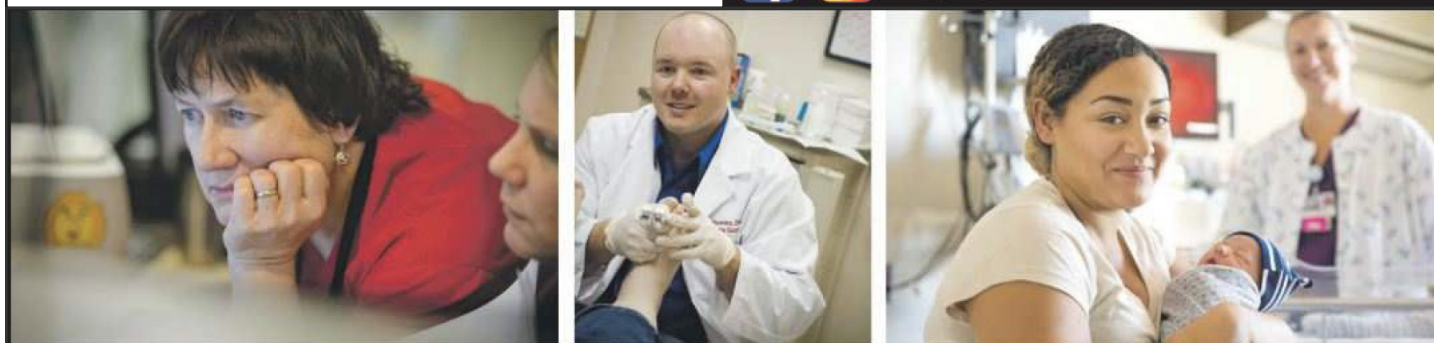
